A huge congratulations to all those that completed the Summer Reading Challenge - what a fantastic achievement!

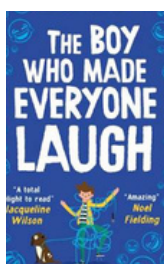

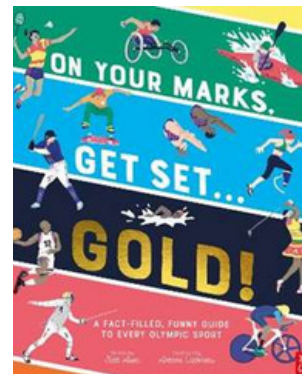
The Bad Guys Volumes 1-12 By Aaron Blabey

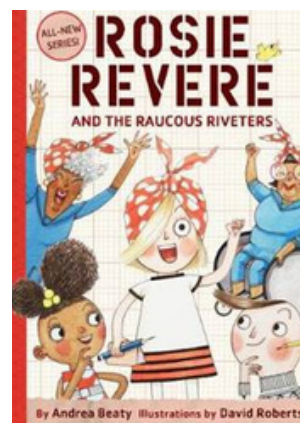
Twitch by M.G. Leonard

This lively, illustrated story sees the character of Rosie Revere make the transition from picture book to a first "chapters" book for newly independent readers.

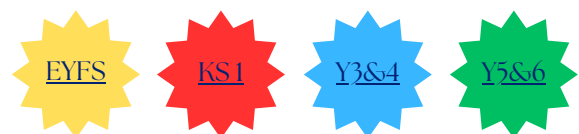
