Dealing with E-safety Issues

Don't retaliate.

Use the school website's e-safety help-page.

Remember your digital footprint.

Take advice from the e-safety posters around the school.

Respect the school's digital property

Don't use the devices near water.

Do not download apps or games

No food or drink in the Computing Suite.

Only use teacher-approved sites

Only take digital photos with permission.

Remember the School Values rules when using school devices.

Leave your personal devices at the Reception Desk.

Proper use of devices in school

Don't share your passwords.

REMEMBER your digital footprint. EVERYTHING is monitored.



Using Social Media

Always use mutual respect online.

If you don't know who it's from, don't reply.

Only post with permission.

Know how to report disrespect on your accounts.

Don't accept strangers as friends.

Keep your passwords secure.

Know how to block unwanted visitors.

Turn to a trusted adult or friend when you have an issue.

Remember your digital footprint

NEVER meet up with a social media stranger.

Most apps need a certain age. Pick the right apps for you

Don't accept follow requests from random strangers.

Musically.ly or lively are quite dangerous unless you have a private account but with lively you can't.

If you pick an app make sure you make it private. Also tell a trusted adult before using it.



Check the pegi rating make sure it is ok for your age

Don't go on to any over age social media website. Check the pegi rating. Don't ever put your details on any social media.

There are many e-safety incidents happening where apps like: snapchat,instagram, musically.ly just anything that gives strangers access to your uploads and posts can be very dangerous and risky although it can be good to chat with people you know.

Use the Stay Safe button, on our website. This sends your issue straight to Mr Bowles who will deal with it quickly.

After you get your worry in the e-safety post box Mr Poston will help you out and talk about your issue.

Reporting problems

Tell any trusted adult at school. They are all trained in e-safety and can help.

Always tell a trusted adult at home. This should be step number 1.
